The McGregor story starts in 1877 when Amasa Stone, the legendary capitalist and preeminent Cleveland philanthropist, and his wife, Julia, built and endowed one of the first private organizations in Cleveland specifically for the care of seniors — the Home for Aged Women, later to be renamed the Amasa Stone House, on what is now East 46th Street and Cedar Avenue.

Later the Amasa Stone House and McGregor merged with a common legacy of The Gardens Of McGregor and in 2001 successfully combined the services into one new facility to enable greater efficiencies, with the completion of "The Gardens" in 2004.

Recognized as a leader of innovation and high value services, The McGregor Foundation continues its mission through philanthropy that enables programs and resources to continue to be available including affordable housing, workforce development for those who work with seniors and total quality of life programming for seniors in all settings, wherever they call home.

As the McGregor campus landscape evolves, one of its priorities -affordable housing and services - is being realized on part of the expanded 45-acre campus. The three-story, 90-unit building is designed to serve the growing population of older adults using combined allocations of private pay market rates and a Medicaid waiver or the McGregor PACE program.

McGregor PACE (Program of all-inclusive Care for the Elderly) helps qualified seniors in Cuyahoga County and serves as an alternative to residential nursing homes by allowing participants to enjoy the comfort and security of familiar surroundings, neighborhoods and their community. Providing access to three PACE Health Centers, the Pace Center at Forest Hill, will be joining forces among the campus services, offering further enhancements. Like many of Cleveland's nonprofit organizations, the McGregor Story begins with a great desire to establish business relationships through partnerships within the community and its leadership committed to building on that tradition and a lasting legacy!
